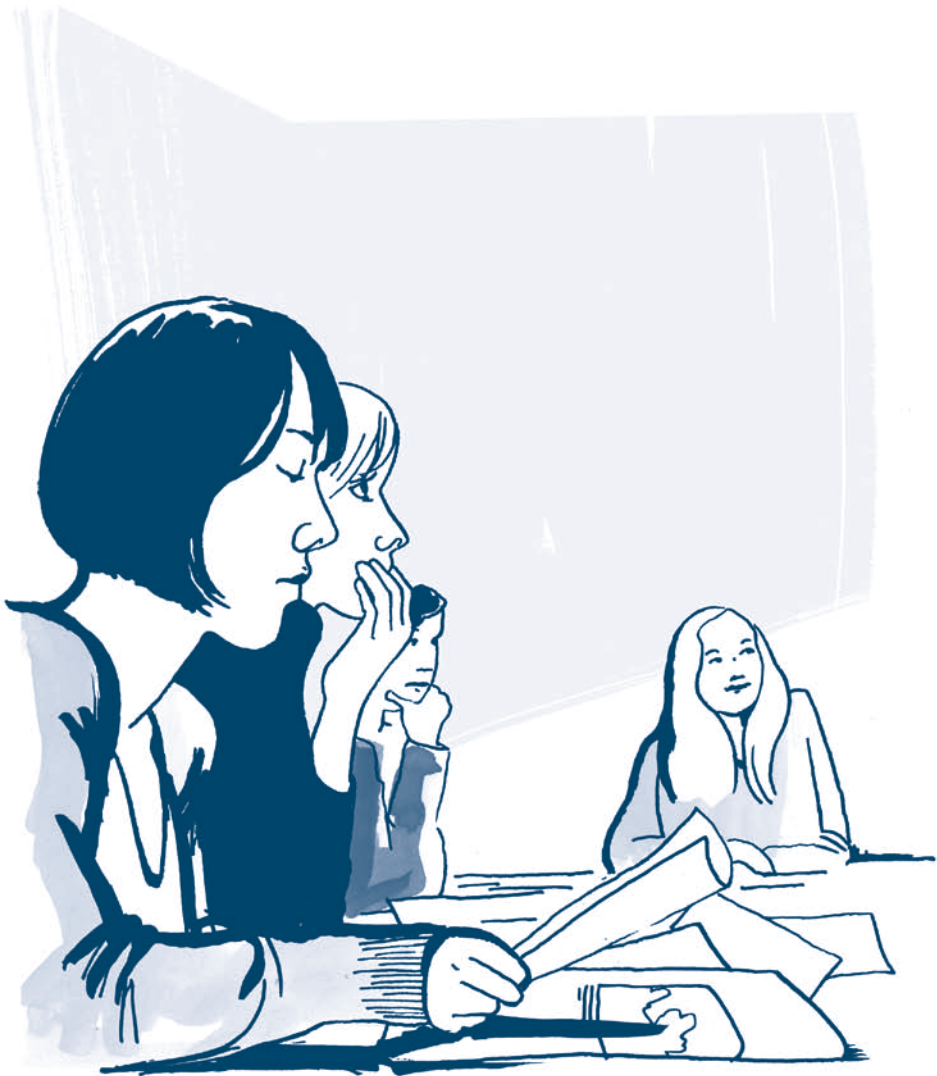

Booking terms and conditions

1 Reservation and confirmation

Reservation will only be complete when accompanied by the registration fee of £60 and the tuition deposit of £200. This £200 tuition deposit and £60 registration fee are non-refundable and will be deducted from the total course fees payable. The balance of the course fees is payable at least 28 days before your course start date. On receipt of the deposit we will send you confirmation of your reserved place on the course giving the balance of the fees payable. If you book your course less than 28 days before your course start date, full course fees are payable immediately. If your preferred start date or course is unavailable we will contact you to offer alternative dates/courses. Deposits and tuition fees are not transferable from student to student nor other University courses.

2 Payment of fees

All tuition fees are payable in pounds sterling and can be made as follows:

- Online: see instructions on page 7
- Bank transfer: please note that all bank charges must be paid by you. We require a copy of the bank transfer details together with the name and student ID number. Please email or fax us a copy of this as soon as payment is made.
- Cheques or banker's draft in sterling drawn on a UK bank.
- Credit card: please give the cardholder's full name, full address, card name, number, expiry date, and the three-digit security code on the back of the card.

Please note there is no reduction in fees when a course includes a Public Holiday(s).

3 Cancellation before arrival

If you want to cancel your course before arrival, you must inform us in writing at least 28 days before your course start date and return the Letter of Confirmation. We will refund your tuition fees in full less the non-refundable deposit (£200) and registration fee (£60). If you cancel your programme less than 28 days before your programme start date or do not arrive to take your programme, you will be charged tuition fees for four weeks in addition to the non-refundable deposit (£200) and registration fee (£60). If you have booked a course of less than four weeks you will be charged the full course fees plus the registration fee (£60). If you have been issued with a CAS you will also be charged the £10 CAS fee.

4 Cancellation and course changes after arrival

Once a programme has started, no refunds will be made under any circumstances.

A programme is any combination of any of our courses of one week or more. Once you have started your programme, changes to General English courses can be made at any time. You will be able to join a different course the following Monday or on the relevant start date of the course you are changing to. If you want to change your General English course to Academic English you will have to wait until the next available start date and give a minimum of two weeks' notice. Changes to Academic English courses can be accommodated, but you will have to wait until the end of the current block before you can change courses. No changes are permitted to English Plus courses of four weeks, English Language for the Arts or IELTS / PTE Academic Preparation. Students booking English Plus Art and Design for longer than four weeks can change to another Language Centre course, but you will have to wait until the end of the current block and 28 days' notice is required. In all cases a course change fee of £50 will apply to cover administration costs. If the course you change to is cheaper than the course originally booked, the balance of fees will not be refunded.

5 Visa refusal

In the case of a visa refusal, the registration fee and tuition and accommodation deposits/fees can either be transferred to a later start date or will be refunded, as long as we receive a copy of the visa refusal letter at least eight days before the course start date. If we receive notification less than eight days before the course start date, you will be charged for one week's accommodation, if accommodation has been booked, plus the tuition deposit (£200) and registration fee (£60). CAS fees cannot be refunded or transferred to a later start date.

6 Postponement

If you wish to postpone your course start date before you arrive, you must give us 28 days' notice in writing. We will give you a credit for all tuition and accommodation fees that have been paid. You must use the credit within one year or lose your fees. If you give us less than 28 days' notice you will lose 4 weeks' tuition fees. Once you have started your programme you cannot postpone any part of your programme.

7 Holiday

Holiday must be booked in weekly blocks, starting on a Monday and returning on a Monday. Students on courses of 12 weeks or more may take a holiday of one week for every 12 weeks booked. 14 days' notice is required. Your course will be extended accordingly, depending on your visa status. Students on a General Student Visa: if the holiday you take means your course

finishes after the end date of your visa, you forfeit any tuition you are not able to take because of the conditions of your visa. If you take a holiday from Academic English, your extra weeks at the end of your course will be General English.

8 Attendance

You are expected to attend classes regularly and on time. You forfeit tuition if you are late, absent or leave before the course ends. It is your responsibility to ensure you meet the attendance requirements of your visa. If you do not meet the necessary requirements, it is our responsibility to report your non-attendance to the UK Border Agency. You will only receive a Certificate of Attendance if you attend at least 80 per cent of your classes. If we consider your attendance to be unsatisfactory, we reserve the right to refuse you a CAS for future bookings. All students should be aware that poor attendance of their classes will result in removal from The Language Centre. No refund will be given.

9 Late arrivals

If you arrive after the start date for your course, no refunds will be made for missed classes.

10 Course Entry Levels

It is your responsibility to check the level of English you need for the course you wish to take and ensure you are at the correct level when you arrive. We will test your level of English on your first day at The Language Centre. If we assess your level of English to be unsuitable for the course you have booked, we reserve the right to place you on a different course, which may have fewer lessons and a different curriculum. If you are placed in a cheaper course you will not receive any refund of tuition fees.

11 Insurance

The Language Centre does not provide insurance, but we strongly recommend that you take out an appropriate insurance policy to cover yourself against loss of fees as a result of illness, accidents, non-arrival, absence or unexpected termination of your course. 12 Combination courses

If you book more than one course with us (e.g. two weeks of General English followed by four weeks of English Plus), tuition fees for each separate course will apply (e.g. you will be charged the two-week General English rate plus the four-week English Plus rate).

13 Low demand of levels and courses

In the event of low demand for a particular level, The Language Centre reserves the right to offer you an alternative course(s), which may include transferring all or some of your tuition fees into one-to-one classes, subject to your visa status. In the event that a course does not run due to low demand, we will give you at least eight days' notice. We will offer you an alternative course or refund your tuition fees, minus the Registration Fee of £60 if you have booked an English Plus course that does not run. If you choose not to take the alternative course offered, you must take General English 15 and we will refund you the difference between the General English fees and English Plus fees. If there is a balance of tuition fees due because of differences in tuition fees, a refund will be made. If you have entered the UK on a General Student Visa you must take an alternative course at The Language Centre in order to fulfil your visa requirements.

14 Conduct

We reserve the right to expel any student without warning who seriously or persistently misbehaves. This is the decision of the Head of The Language Centre. No refunds will be made for lessons missed as a result of expulsion.

15 Time and location of lessons

All courses run from Monday to Friday and lessons may be scheduled in the morning or afternoon, according to operational factors, such as room availability at different points during the year. It is not possible to request morning or afternoon lessons. At busy times of the year, English classes may take place at other University of the Arts London buildings.

16 Force majeure

We shall not be liable for any failure or delay in the performance, in whole or part, of any of our obligations arising from or attributable to acts, events, omissions or accidents beyond our reasonable control, including, but not limited to strikes, lock-outs or other industrial disputes (whether involving our workforce or the workforce of any other part), act of God, war, riot, civil commotion, malicious damage, compliance with any law or governmental order, rule regulation or direction, accident, breakdown of plant or machinery, fire, flood, volcanic ash, storm, pandemics, epidemics or other outbreaks of disease or infection, failure in the public supply of electricity, heating, lighting, air conditioning or telecommunications equipment.

The Language Centre agrees to provide the student with:

- An adequate internship placement as agreed on the 'Placement Confirmation' and that all details agreed on the said documentation be accurate and appropriate to such an agreed placement.
- A host company that falls under the area of work that the candidate reasonably requests on their application.
- A service so that the student may contact us in case of any problems arising from their internship placement. The student may contact us to discuss any such problems and we will assist in rectifying any such problems as agreed with the host work placement and the student.
- An alternative internship placement should the candidate find the placement unsuitable (up to half way through their placement) and not what was reasonably agreed on and confirmed by the student in the form of the 'Placement Confirmation'.

- Monitoring and assessment of the student whilst they are at their host work placement. We will provide the student with full reports on their progress at the reasonable request of the student and at the end of their placement.
- Fair and responsible treatment at all times.
- A second interview if the first suitable interview was not successful.
- The possibility of a third interview only if the work placement sector chosen permits this. A third interview is not guaranteed.

The Language Centre does not agree to:

- Find an alternative placement for the student should the student employment be terminated due to the student not performing his/her job as the employer requests.
- Assist in any issues regarding the breaking of any UK laws and any consequences resulting from such a fact.
- Assist in any legal matters in connection with the internship placement, accommodation, police, legal courts and any other such legal matters.
- Provide any medical assistance.

The student agrees:

- To accept the placement arranged if it complies with the placement requested.
- To follow and agree to the rules of their internship placement and adjust to UK manners and culture to the best of their ability.

- To correspond any problems whilst they are in the UK with The Language Centre.

- Not to invite any third party to their host work placement, unless the said third party has been agreed by and placed via The Language Centre and the student's agent (where applicable) in their country of origin.

- To adjust to the host company's reasonable needs should the host company require.

- To adjust to the company's needs should the host company feel that you are not suitable for the original job that you were employed to do and accept an alternative offer of employment by such host companies; this will include reasons such as low level of English.

- Not to behave in such a way that results in criminal activity or breaks UK law in any way.

- To complete all evaluations or documents as required by The Language Centre.

- Not to provide any false or wilfully inaccurate documents to The Language Centre at any time including in the form of a Curriculum Vitae.

- To treat all people with respect at all times regardless of sex, race, sexual orientation, religion, social background or any such group.

- Not to leave a host company unless it is the end of your contractual period with such a company unless otherwise agreed with The Language Centre.

- To the following cancellation fees (in relation to the work placement fee only our standard cancellation fees apply for your English course):

- Prior to interviews being arranged:
 - £60 for any accepted booking up to two weeks prior to placement start date
 - £120 cancellation fee thereafter.

With interviews arranged/attended:

- £180 when an interview has been arranged but not yet attended, or if a first interview was unsuccessful and a further interview is not available within the chosen field (in the case of more specialised fields).
- £300 when an interview has been attended and the placement confirmed or after two suitable interviews have been attended whatever the outcome.

Payment of fees

The work placement fee must be paid in full with the fees for your English language course.

1 Booking and confirmation

Homestay, house share and LSE residences

Reservation will only be complete when accompanied by a deposit of one week's accommodation fee (and airport transfer fee, where applicable). This deposit will be deducted from the total fees payable. On receipt of the deposit, we will send you a booking confirmation of your reserved place with one of our families, accompanied by an invoice giving the balance of the fees. The balance of the accommodation fees is payable at least seven days before your arrival in London. Once your full fees have been paid, you will receive an updated invoice showing payment in full.

2 Payment of accommodation fees

Homestay, house share and LSE residences

All accommodation fees are to be paid in pounds sterling and should be transferred with your tuition fees by bank transfer, cheque, banker's draft, credit card or online.

3 Cancellation and refunds

a) Cancellation of accommodation before arrival

Homestay and house share and LSE residences

You must give The Language Centre at least eight days' notice in writing of any intended cancellation or postponement to the starting date of your booked accommodation for your deposit to be refunded. If you give less than eight days' notice, for whatever reason, a cancellation fee of one week's accommodation will apply. The rest of the accommodation fees will be refunded.

b) Cancellation of accommodation after arrival

Homestay

If you need to leave your host family after arriving, you will be required to give The Language Centre at least eight days' written notice. If you fail to do so, one week's cancellation charge will apply. The balance of accommodation fees will be refunded.

House share and LSE residences

No refunds can be made after arrival.

4 Arrival

Homestay

The preferred arrival and departure day is Sunday, but arrangements can be made for other days of the week if requested, subject to availability.

Extra nights' accommodation can normally be booked subject to availability and are charged on a pro-rata basis, based on the weekly (seven-day) rate.

House share

Arrival and departure day is Sunday.

LSE residences

Arrival can be on any day. Extra nights' accommodation can normally be booked subject to availability and are charged on a daily-rate basis.
